TOUR LINES UP NIGHT OF FRIGHTS

A SPOOKTACULAR tour will highlight the haunted history of an unassuming Windsor home in the lead up to Halloween.

Tour company Twisted History will tell the tale of the shocking murder of Emily Mather, who was killed at a house in Andrew St more

than 120 years ago by Australia's first recorded serial killer and Jack the Ripper suspect Frederick Bailey.

The body of Ms Mather, Bailey's second wife, was found in the house three months after her death.

Tour organiser Deb Robinson said it was one of

the most popular parts of the tour and one of her "favourite murders".

She said the ghost of Ms Mather still haunts the house which became a tourist attraction for seances and mediums in the 19th century.
